

Virginia Woolf (1882-1941) was one of the twentieth century's most important writers. In addition to writing ten novels, including *Mrs. Dalloway* and *To the Lighthouse*,

Woolf was the cofounder of the Hogarth Press and a prolific essayist and critic. Her manifesto *A Room of One's Own* is a cornerstone of modern feminist thought.

Urmila Seshagiri is Distinguished Professor of Humanities and Professor of English at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. She is the author of *Race and the Modernist Imagination*, the editor of the Oxford World's Classics edition of Virginia Woolf's *Jacob's Room*, and a contributor to the *Los Angeles Review of Books*.


In 1907, eight years before she published her first novel, a twenty-five-year-old Virginia Woolf drafted three interconnected comic stories chronicling the adventures of a giantess named Violet — a teasing tribute to Woolf's friend Mary Violet Dickinson. But it was only in 2022 that Woolf scholar Urmila Seshagiri discovered a final, revised typescript of the stories. The typescript revealed that Woolf had finished this mock-biography, making it her first fully realised literary experiment and a work that anticipates her later masterpieces. Published here for the first time in its final form, *The Life of Violet* blends fantasy, fairy tale, and satire as it transports readers into a magical world where the heroine triumphs over sea-monsters as well as stifling social traditions.

In these irresistible and riotously plotted stories, Violet, who has powers 'as marvelous as her height', gleefully flouts aristocratic proprieties, finds joy in building 'a cottage of one's own', and travels to Japan to help create a radical new social order. Amid flights of fancy such as a snowfall of sugared almonds and bathtubs made of painted ostrich eggs, *The Life of Violet* upends the marriage plot, rejects the Victorian belief that women must choose between virtue and ambition, and celebrates women's friendships and laughter.

A major literary discovery that heralds Woolf's ambitions to revolutionise fiction and sheds new light on her great themes, *The Life of Violet* is first and foremost a delight to read

They — a mother and her sixteen-year-old daughter — live in an apartment above a hairdresser's shop in a small island town. Each day is marked by routine and quiet intimacy. They are so enmeshed, so alike in their manners and opinions, it can be hard to tell them apart.

Then the mother begins to feel unwell. They carry on with their lives, talk about anything but the diagnosis. The mother goes in and out of hospital, and the daughter, just starting high school, makes new friends — Tove Dunk, Hafni, Bob, Desert Boots — but remains essentially alone. Illness, and the possibility of loss, cast a growing shadow over her life.

Writing in a multi-layered, perpetual present tense, Helle Helle finds a tender voice for the comedy and awkwardness of her heroines' lives, rendered into riveting and affecting English by acclaimed translator Martin Aitken. *they* is an exquisite portrait of the fragile love between a mother and daughter, and a love letter to 1980s life on the island of Lolland, where the author grew up.





Haikus

BEVERLEY FARMER

Beverley Farmer is one of our finest prose writers, but her new book, *For the Seasons: Haikus*, is likely to make her reputation as a poet too. The manuscript of *For the Seasons*, composed over twenty-five years ago, was rediscovered by the critic and scholar Lyn Jacobs after Farmer's death in 2018. The collection has never been published in full before. It joins the three prose works by Farmer Giramondo has now brought back into print: the novels *Alone* and *The Seal Woman* and the journal *A Body of Water*.

The haikus collected in *For the Seasons* are arranged in sections, beginning with Spring then progressing to Summer and Autumn and ending with Winter. One is immediately struck by the delicacy of Farmer's observations, drawn from her immersion in the coastal landscape around Point Lonsdale on the Bellarine Peninsula in southern Victoria. The constraints imposed by the haiku form encourage attention to the finest details and textures – of light and colour, of air and sand and sea – and foster an awareness of the transient life they hold, its beauty, vitality and decay. The emotion is all in the detail, the 'T' barely features, yet the mood of the seasons, and their progression is keenly registered. Farmer's poetry is remarkable in this respect, modest, self-effacing, and yet revelatory in its intensity.


Shot through with gallows humour and speaking in the voice of a trusted best friend, this self-deprecating horror novel explores medical trauma through Irish folklore, asking 'Can a sick woman *ever* be trusted?'

Brigid – that's the Irish Breej, not 'Bridge-id', though it's not like she'd correct you – has had a rough go of it. Her mother abused her when she was little, her best friend (and secret crush) is too busy chasing some blonde to answer Brigid's calls, and she lost her job thanks to chronic pelvic pain with no identifiable cause. As a self-doubting, disabled adult, she's certain that everything that has happened to her is her fault.

Now her mother has gone missing and Brigid's only option is to move back into her childhood home in the idyllic Midwestern town of St. Charles, Illinois. Soon the uncanny begins: a particular crow that once harassed her reappears, following her everywhere. A painting of Jesus keeps coming back, no matter how many times she throws it away. Frozen body parts show up in places rubber band balls and door stoppers ought to be. Every night the same nightmare repeats: her real mother is dead and decaying in the closet, and the identical mother who raised her is not her mother. But it's all in Brigid's head. It's all her fault. It must be. What other explanation could there be?

After all, since when can a sick woman be trusted?
