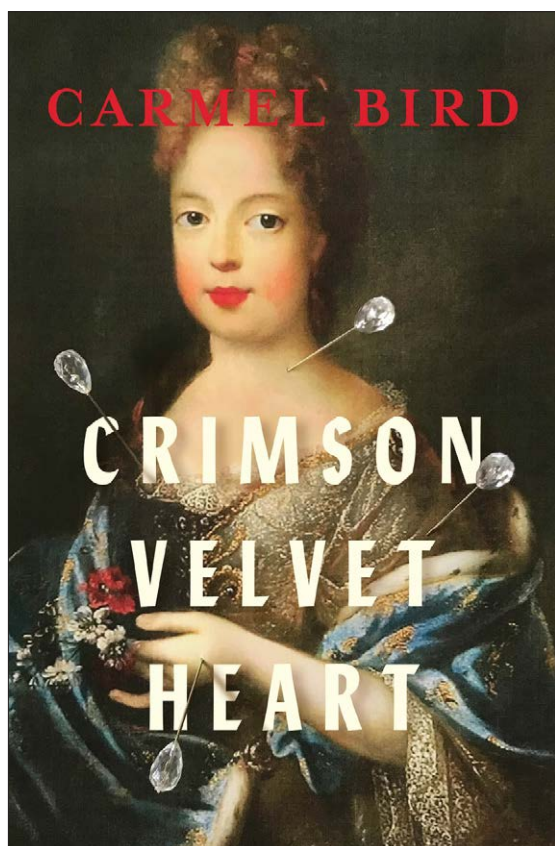

There was a kind of grotesquerie to the dazzle and magnificence, a vicious underlay of thorns beneath the bed of roses, and a vast shadow floating, looming overhead. The kingdom was forever at war, and there was an eerie strangeness in the shining trio of the king, his wife, and the little princess from Savoy.

It is 1696. Louis XIV, absolute monarch in his sunset years, with his secret wife by his side, believes his grandson will succeed him and will continue the dynasty. As part of the spoils of war, he brings from Savoy, a child, a youthful bride for that grandson. In this bride the king gets more than he could ever have bargained for. She is enchanting, and he is bewitched. Has the king fallen madly in love with this Princess Marie-Adélaïde of Savoy? What exactly is the bond between these two?

At the court of Versailles, there is lavish magnificence including the vast gardens and the Hall of Mirrors. But it is also where dark, enchanting fairytales come to prominence. News of war is never far away. And tantalising beauty is undercut by threat. The tale is narrated in part by Sister Clare, a childhood friend of Marie-Adélaïde, who after losing the young man she loves to war and then the princess to disease, becomes a nun. For Clare it is her devoted mission to tell the story of Marie-Adélaïde, mother of the child who will become Louis XV.

Crimson Velvet Heart is a visionary novel on Adélaïde’s life – both strange and enthralling – where Carmel Bird’s exquisite language and rich understanding of history and human nature capture both the spirit and the mystery of love and loss.

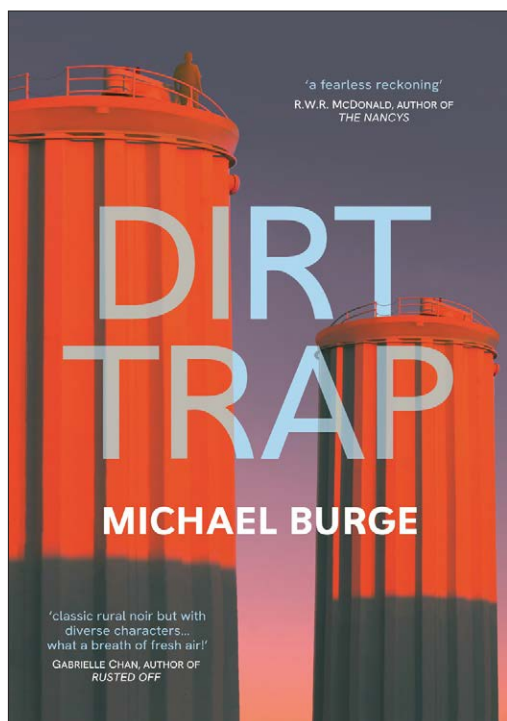

Journalist James Brandt lives in a brittle truce with his partner Dylan and his family, never talking about the homophobic attacks he exposed in his rural hometown, including the brutal death of a beloved cousin twenty years ago.

BEST OF AUSTRALIAN POEMS 2025

EDITED BY NAM LE AND JILL JONES

- *Best of Australian Poems* is an annual anthology collecting previously published and unpublished poems to create a poetic snapshot and barometer of the year that was. Capturing the richness and diversity of Australian poetry across a timeframe of 1 July 2024 – 30 June 2025, the series (now in its fifth year) explores how poetic responses to the contemporary moment develop with each passing year

The book begins with introductory words and framing by its 2025 editors, multiple award-winning and highly respected poets, authors and editors, Nam Le and Jill Jones. Both Jill and Nam enjoy the highest reputations in their literary vocations. Jill is one of the longest-standing Australian poets of enduring innovation and prodigiousness, with her *Acrobat Music: New & Selected Poems*, published in 2023. Nam's 2008 short-story collection, *The Boat*, was seen to restore the genre to centrestage, garnering national and overseas attention. His debut poetry book, *36 Ways of Writing a Vietnamese Poem*, won Book of the Year (2024) at the recent NSW Literary Awards, while also gathering a range of other commendations and award listings, including for the ALS Gold Medal.

Previous editors of this prestigious series have been Ellen van Neerven and Toby Fitch (2021); Jeanine Leane and Judith Beveridge (2022); Panda Wong and Gig Ryan (2023); and Kate Lilley and Shastra Deo (2024).

The *Best of Australian Poems (BoAP)* series is published by Australia's national poetry organisation, Australian Poetry, and features two different guest editors each year, to amplify the range of voices selected. It is funded by Creative Australia, Creative Victoria and individual patrons.

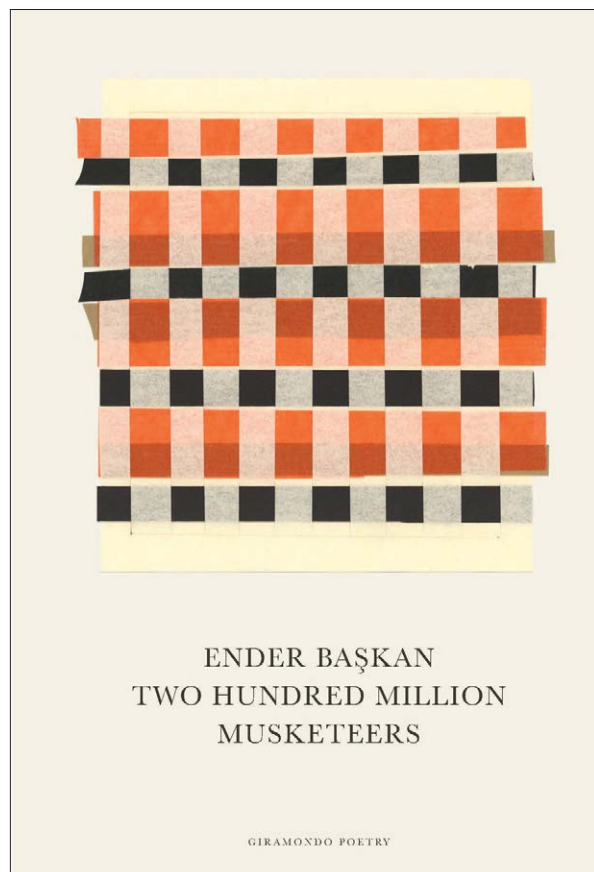

Nam Le is the author of *The Boat*, *On David Malouf*, and *36 Ways of Writing a Vietnamese Poem*, which was published last year in Australia, the U.S. and the U.K. Poems from it appeared in *Heat*, *Overland*, *Paris Review*, *Poetry*, *Granta*, *APR*, and elsewhere.

Jill Jones' latest book is *Acrobat Music: New & Selected Poems* (2023), short-listed for the 2024 John Bray Poetry Prize, long-listed for the 2024 ALS Gold Medal and commended in the 2023 Wesley Michel Wright Prize. - Başkan's writing explores the complexities of new parenthood and family life, and anxieties about the future his children will grow up in

Ender Başkan's debut poetry collection depicts the intensity of life as a parent of young children. It maps the shifting trains of thought which go with the experience of being a new parent, when one's attention is drawn in many different directions between child-rearing and house-keeping, domestic crises, the need to earn a living, and the responsibilities you have to the past as well as to the future, to your own parents and grandparents, as well as to your children. Work, friendships, social life and creative practice are all altered. The poet reflects on his own childhood, and his grandparents' exile from their homeland in Turkey, to which he returns several times in the course of the book, with his own young family. But there is also an increased awareness of the future, not only to the world his children will grow up in, but to the kind of world that is being built right now, in homes, workplaces, and in social and political allegiances.

Perhaps most tellingly, since Ender Başkan is a poet, he is subsumed in the flood of language, as it emerges from the mouths of his youngsters, indeed from his own mouth, as he talks to them. Words and sounds and the effects of language come to the fore. The imagination of children lends its own wonder and surrealism to that of the poet. His writing is direct, playful, absurd, staunch and political. In these respects, Başkan follows in the footsteps of the previous generation of Australia's poets of migrant background, all of them masters of language Pi.O., Chris Mann, Antigone Kefala and above all the late Ania Walwicz, his close friend and mentor.

Feather of a featherless bird / Pluma de un Pájaro Desplumado, a bilingual collection of poems by Juan Garrido Salgado, covers a wide range of themes from the intimate and personal to the political and social, focusing mainly on the onslaught of fascism in the world and the dehumanisation of this era of digital domination and colonialism and wars, among which the genocide against the Palestinian people stands out.

Poetry that expresses the loneliness, isolation and pain of existence, while resisting with words to reveal 'what is silenced, what is hidden and what is denied'. The use of the bird as a representation of the poet, and of birds and their wings and feathers as metaphors for the creation of the poems themselves, weaves through the book the poetic voice that cries out for love and freedom, and asks, 'Where are we going / Humanity anchored in the unreason of an elite / We are agony of thousands, dust of riddled stars.'

Is poetry writing labour? Perhaps I am so damaged that I don't consider writing poetry labour. Every weekend I replenish myself by collapsing and every week I work within a system that is hideous and greasy, that remains ineffective in dealing with whatever it claims to tackle. I am essentially the system: ineffective, hideous, greasy... confused. I profit from the work I do, from the system that I am. Then I confront myself. Then I turn to poetry. And if I am successful, I want my poetry to resemble the way my body labours, like the waves, coming and keep coming. There seems no beginning nor end in labour. Across borders of gender, language, immigration, language, experience, and the lyric 'I', I position myself as a non-Subject that confronts Capitalism in my own turn/term.

Divided into five sections, *And the Waves* investigates the ethics of producing / 'labouring' poetry. I (and 'I') am essentially not Australian (whatever that means), you see.

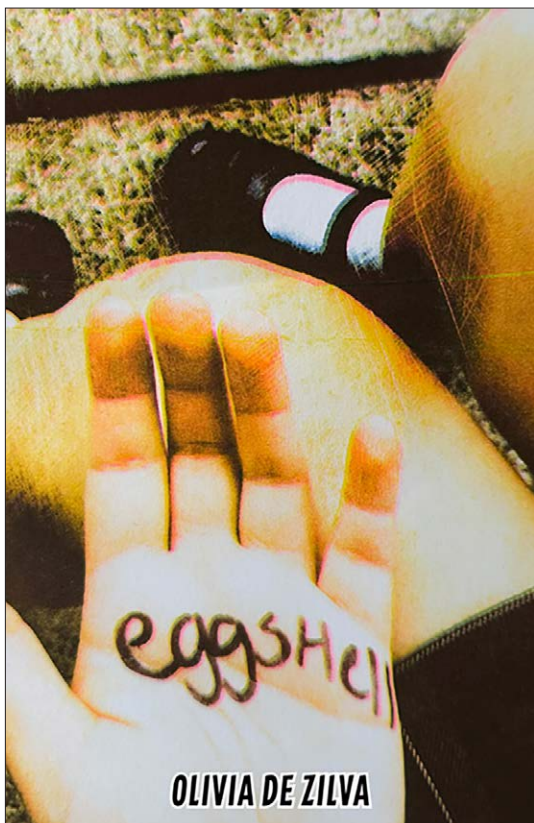

OLIVIA DE ZILVA

- Olivia de Zilva has been awarded prizes including the AAWP Novella Prize, Deakin University Non-Fiction Prize, the Kat Muscat Fellowship and the Richell Prize for Emerging Writers

Set in 2000s Adelaide, *Eggshell* tells the story of Kira, a sarcastic, cynical teenager living in a council flat with her Cantonese grandmother (Apo) and her rebellious older cousin, Jake. This novella starts and ends with Kira's experience of Year 12 where she is caught between two worlds: being a subservient Cantonese granddaughter and a Big Brother-watching, boy-crazy Australian schoolgirl. *Eggshell* is a young-adult novella dealing with themes of identity, racism, romance, sexuality and adolescence.

'As a Chinese Australian who lived through the early 2000s, this stunning novella gave me cultural whiplash, taking me straight back to my salad days of early internet, teen fashion mags, Charlie perfume in the girl's locker rooms and rites of passages with privileged Western students! 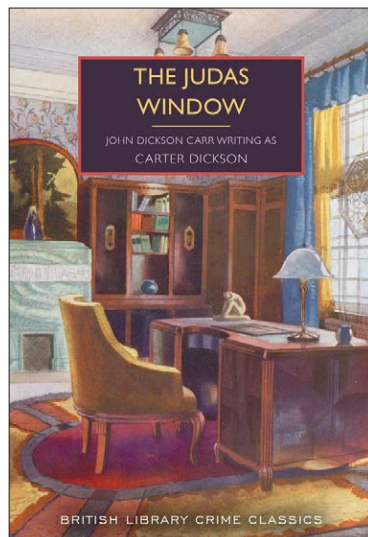
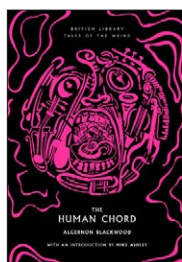

He is, of course, prime suspect. After setting up this devilish scenario, unravels an ingenious courtroom thriller, in which the razor-sharp amateur detective (and barrister) Sir Henry Merrivale stars in all of his outlandish glory and the mystery of the 'Judas Window' is revealed.



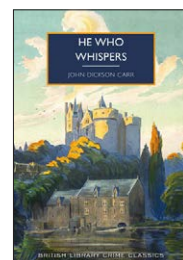
