

LOOKING FROM THE NORTH

Australian history from the top down HENRY REYNOLDS

Henry Reynolds' ground-breaking re-examination of Australian colonisation from the north down.

When acclaimed historian Henry Reynolds moved from Hobart to Townsville to teach Australian history in the 1960s, he discovered the books of the period covered very little about northern Australia and First Nations peoples. After recognising the importance of local history and frontier violence, he ended up transforming Australian history in ways he could never have imagined.

In *Looking from the North* Reynolds again turns Australian history on its axis in an exploration of colonisation north of the Tropic of Capricorn. Reynolds explores the stories of the European, Chinese, Japanese and Pacific Islander people who were vital to the settlement of the north. Along with the experience of First Nations peoples, from employment on stations and as native police, to the land rights and homelands movements. Reynolds shows how the colonisation of the north, beginning in 1861, was a very different venture to settlement in the south, and argues that it provides profoundly important lessons for the world we live in today.




About the author:

Sydney-born painter John Joseph Wardell Power, better known as J. W. Power, was Australia's most accomplished artist of the interwar years. In London and Paris in the 1920s and 1930s, Power's unique blend of cubism, surrealism and abstraction found an audience in the heart of the avant-garde. Today, he is chiefly remembered as a benefactor whose extraordinary gifts led to the founding of the Power Institute at the University of Sydney in 1968 and the establishment of the Museum of Contemporary Art in 1991. This monograph, accompanying the *J.W. Power: Art, War and the Avant-garde* exhibition at the University of Sydney's Chau Chak Wing Museum, reveals his singular role in Australian art in the 20th century.

the Oceans Institute of the University of Western Australia, she is also the founder of Oceanswell, Sri Lanka's first marine conservation research and education organisation. Her work has been featured in *National Geographic* and *The New York Times* and by the BBC and TED, and in 2024 she was invited to join the UN Secretary General's Scientific Advisory Board.



Lithuania is often portrayed as a small nation-state that has survived against the odds of history: together with Estonia and Latvia, it won independence at the end of the First World War, lost it to the Soviet Union in 1939-40, regained it in 1990-1991, and joined NATO and the EU in 2004, angering the Kremlin. But Lithuania's rich and complex history stretches back much further than these events, and much further than many realise.

Yet it was in competition with Poles, and under Russian imperial rule, that the modern ethnic Lithuanian nation emerged in the nineteenth century.

This is a lively and accessible history of a fascinating country that was once much larger than it is today; a land where, for centuries, peoples and communities — including Belarusians, Ukrainians, Germans, Poles, Russians, Jews, Karaites and Tatars — lived together in concord and discord.
