




Do you ever look for shapes in the clouds?

About the authors & illustrator:

Thomas Higgs is a teacher living in Darwin. His undergraduate degree in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies gave him a foundation for building deep and meaningful connections with Aboriginal Australians. He believes all young people should learn about the history and culture of First Nations people and that collaborative storytelling such as this is integral to reconciliation.

Colin Hall is an Alawa man from the Roper River region. He works at the Ngukurr Language Centre supporting the delivery of Kriol language courses and is also working to revive the endangered Alawa language of his ancestors. He assisted Higgs in the writing of Ayaiga's story through the inclusion of many Alawa and Kriol words.

Wally Wilfred is a Wägilak man and artist living and working in the Roper River region, who works with the Ngukurr Art Centre. Wally brings together traditional techniques with bold and contemporary use of colour. Wally's work explores traditional and present-day culture with history and storytelling.

AYAIGA


Age range 10+

In the remote Roper River region of the Northern Territory more than 120 years ago, an Alawa man committed an act of such exceptional bravery that a King took notice.

Ayaiga had been arrested for stealing from one of the vast cattle stations established on traditional Alawa Country. The heavyweight boxing champion of the Australian Police, Constable William Francis Johns, was bringing him in to Leichhardt's Bar Police Station – the constable on horseback, with Ayaiga, manacled by the neck, attempting to keep up on foot. Johns foolishly attempted to cross a flooded creek and was knocked unconscious when his panicked horse kicked him in the head. Ayaiga, burdened by his heavy chain, heroically saved Johns from drowning and remained by the constable's side as he recovered.

Ayaiga became one of only 8 Australian recipients – and the only Indigenous recipient – of the Albert Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life.

With numerous best-sellers, Coral's awards include the 2018 Speech Pathology Awards for Best Book for Language and Literacy Development – Indigenous Children, the 2019 CBCA Book of the Year Eve Pownall Award and the 2021 Caleb Picture Book of the Year Award. Shehas also been shortlisted for the REAL Awards, voted by the children of Australia.

At an early age **Heidi Cooper-Smith** knew she wanted to write and illustrate picture books. 




About the author:

Muriel Spark (1918–2006) was the author of dozens of novels, including *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie, Memento Mori, A Far Cry from Kensington, The Girls of Slender Means, The Ballad of Peckham Rye, The Driver's Seat*, and many more. She became Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire in 1993.

Edward Gorey (1925–2000) was born in Chicago. In 1953 Gorey published *The Unstrung Harp*, the first of his more than one hundred books. In addition to illustrating his own stories, Gorey provided drawings for many books for both children and adults. Of these, New York Review Books has published *The Haunted Looking Glass*, a collection of Gorey's favourite ghost stories; *The War of the Worlds* by H. G. Wells; *Men and Gods* by Rex Warner; *The Unrest-Cure and Other Stories* by Saki; and *Three Ladies Beside the Sea* by Rhoda Levine. He cowrote the NYRB Kids book *Fletcher and Zenobia* with Victoria Chess.
